

Custom Created Quilts

Put memories in a quilt by adding photographs or other media to fabric and incorporating into a custom designed quilt that will last for generations. Prices start at \$40 per square yard and vary depending upon fabrics and complexity of the design.

Digital design Quilting

Quilting Pricing –

Minimum charge is \$25.00.

Quilting prices are based upon square yards in the quilt top. Measure the length in inches times the width in inches to calculate the total square inches. Divide by 1296 to calculate the total square yards. Example: 57 inches wide times 79.5 inches length = 4531.5 square inches divided by 1296 = 3.5 square yards. Prices are all inclusive of thread and needle costs.

Edge to Edge patterns

Edge to edge quilting designs cover the quilt from side to side and repeat down the length of the quilt. The overall design is applied in separate or interlocking rows. Price is dependent upon the density of the quilt design.

Patterns include: Stars, hearts, loops, leaves, fish, spirals, butterflies, holly, moons & stars, stipples and more.

Large - \$ 12.50 per square yard

Medium -\$ 14.50 per square yard

Small-\$ 18.00 per square yard

Semi-Custom Designs

Edge to edge patterns in the body of the quilt with a separate pattern for the borders

\$ 18.50 per square yard

Custom Designs

Any of these elements: Feathers, motifs, circle, fans, individual treatment of blocks, special border designs and turning of the quilt.

Prices start at \$ 25.00 per square yard and may vary based upon complexity.

Other Services:

Backing: You may supply your own backing. See [Tips of Achieving the Best Results with your Quilt](#) for backing directions. Should you wish me to supply the backing; I will do my best to match the color and style of your quilt. I also have muslin available in natural or white. Check with me directly for prices.

Batting: You may supply your own batting. Allow 4 to 6 inches on all sides.

The following battings can be provided at \$6.50 per yard

Hobbs Heirloom 80/20
Hobbs Wool

Binding: You provide your 2 ½ "wide continuous binding and I will machine sew to the front of your quilt and hand stitch to the back for \$1.50 per running foot.

Tips for Achieving the Best Results with your Quilt

1) Quilt top

- a. Before cutting and attaching borders, measure your quilt from top to bottom through the center, and then cut your side borders to that measurement. Attach the side borders adjusting to fit your quilt by easing or stretching if needed. Press seams toward the border. Then measure your quilt from side to side through the center, cutting your top and bottom borders to that measurement. Attach your top and bottom borders adjusting to fit your quilt by easing or stretching if needed. Again, press seams toward the border. TIP: Opposite borders must always be exactly the same measurements. Please do not start sewing at one end and cut off the leftovers when you get to the other end, as this may cause your quilt to be out of square. There are many good instruction books for quilting on the market to help you with step by step directions or you may call to ask questions.

- b. Press all seams as you want them to lie in the finished quilt
- c. Trim all loose threads and look at the quilt carefully from the front to make sure there are no dark shadows from the dark fabric peeking out behind a light fabric. Shake the top well to remove loose threads.
- d. Be sure your top is square. To determine if your quilt is square, measure diagonally in both directions. The measurement should be the same. Also make sure your edges are even.

Backing :

When purchasing backing fabric, it is important to realize that material is often not straight cut on the bolt, so it will be necessary to allow extra fabric for squaring up your backing. Also, add 6 inches in length and 6 inches in width to your backing to allow for the draw in that takes place during the quilting process.

If your backing is pieced, be sure to remove selvage edges before piecing together. Press seams open and ensure your backing is square.

Batting:

You may have me supply the batting or, if you are providing the batting, be sure to do any preshrinking desired before shipping. Polyester batting does not require preshrinking. Batting should also be 6 inches longer and 6 inches wider than the top.
